Peter and John are arrested

The priests in control of the temple were usually Sadducees, who denied the resurrection of the dead. To their ears, the preaching of Peter and John about Jesus' resurrection was religious sedition. They had the power to arrest them and put them in custody and they did not hesitate to do so. Presented the next day before the Jewish cohort to explain themselves, Peter answers their questioning on the basis of what had happened with the healing of the lame man. Yet as he does so, Peter experiences what might be described as a rush or a charge of divine power that comes directly from the Holy Spirit. This is the first of many incidents when the apostles must defend the faith to the authorities, but spiritually speaking, they never do so unaided. Now as then.
