their head will be exalted with honour.

Praising:

God of the poor, friend of the weak,
give us compassion we pray:

Reading:

Nehemiah 5:9-13
A decision is made

Nehemiah appeals to God and to the threat from those opposed to the rebuilding if the Jews persist in lending and taking interest from their own. He insists that as one Jewish family they stop their unjust behaviour and start doing the right thing. Nehemiah is not putting an end to the lending of money wholesale, but he is writing off the debts currently being carried by his building

crew. Nehemiah's fellow Jews see that this is the immediate course of action they should all take, priests included. As one gathered people they commit themselves spiritually to returning everyone's property and to forgoing the possibility of further claims in the future. Nehemiah shakes out the fold of his garment to symbolise God's judgment on anyone who reneges on their undertaking, and they commit their promise solemnly to the Lord.
