of Egypt's land management may  
not have been in the small print of

God's original vision for Joseph.  
Yet central to Joseph's journey,  
lies an understanding that  
planning for the future is  
essential. It is certainly what sees  
Egypt through the famine. When  
things are going well, it is hard to  
imagine that there may come a  
time when they will not. But  
through the worst of the famine  
everywhere else, there is bread in  
Egypt. God's mercy was not  
completely extinguished and as  
Joseph had experienced that  
mercy, so he becomes an agent  
for it.
