Praising:

Light of the minds that know him, may Christ be light to mine!

My sun in risen splendour, my light of truth divine;

Reading:

Acts 26:12-23 Paul shares the story of his conversion with King Agrippa

In his third account of the road to Damascus, Paul adds that when the light shone from heaven, everyone else present fell to the ground along with him. He also includes the concern voiced by the Lord, that by attacking Christianity so aggressively in fact Paul was hurting himself. A goad was a sharp pointed stick

used to prod an ox or a donkey. Paul explains to Agrippa that God has called him to share Christ's light and to offer forgiveness and the promise of heaven to the Gentiles in particular. Paul has been endeavouring to do this but the Jews are now trying to kill him. As Paul now sees it, everything he has discovered of Christ is consistent with what the Jewish Scriptures had foretold. In dying and rising again, Christ fulfils the Messianic expectation.

Listening:

Praying:

Lord we pray for light for those living in darkness

- those drawn to the unthreatening privacy and unchallenging comfort of the shadows
- those frightened by what they fear the light of God's truth may reveal about them
- those who feel life as it is will do, that who they are and how they are is good enough
