Praising:

A clear pattern emerges: Israel rebels against the Lord and ignores his will for their lives. God duly leaves them to face the consequences of the choices they have made. However, when trouble comes and the people cry to God for help, God hears and

keeps repeating itself. The people may ignore God's commandments because they feel them to be burdensome and overbearing. Stubbornness and wilfulness are also contributing factors. As Nehemiah sees it, Israel is ignoring the guidelines God has carefully put in place that his people may live life to its fullest and richest. Yet in the end, where God's people continually prove faithless, God remains gracious and merciful. When they call to God in desperation, it is simply not in God's nature to leave his children to their own
